PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year begins the 15th anniversary of Straw Dog Writers Guild, and looking back it's amazing to see what we've accomplished. Last year's accomplishments continue to build the reputation---and grow the Guild in new directions.

2024 had two firsts for Straw Dog; the WriteAngles Conference and the hiring of an Executive Consultant, Patricia Pin.

Straw Dog was approached by the WriteAngles organization asking us to take over and present the conference after a 3-year hiatus. The Committee, spearheaded by Ellen Meeropol, held pop-up events to learn what writers wanted the Conference to be, and did an incredible job of fundraising to make this event happen. The Write/Angles Conference was an incredible success and has paved the way for this to become an annual event. Watch for information about this year's conference.

Patricia Pin, who has joined us as Executive Consultant, brings her years of experience at The Mount to Straw Dog to help us improve and refine our organization. A Strategic Planning Committee is working on ways to continue to grow Straw Dog; a newly formed Development Committee will be working to raise funds and seek sponsorships to help Straw Dog continue to grow and serve the writing community.

Some of the highlights of 2024 include:

Grants. - Grants for WA

- We received \$13000 from the Community Foundation of Western MA, which we were awarded in 2023.
- We received \$4440 reimbursement from the ARPA funds that we were awarded in 2023.

This was our second year collaborating with Smith Vocational High School, helping them to launch their literary magazine **The Viking Runestone**. Along with Forbes Library, we celebrated the publication of the magazine, and offered them financial support.

WriteAngles.

The WriteAngles Writers Conference was held on April 6, 2024, at the Northampton Center for the Arts. A one-day program, it featured a keynote address by Shanta Lee, who was presented with the second Abel Meeropol Social Justice Writing Award, and twelve sessions, including panels, roundtable discussions, and participatory workshops.

The Conference was organized and run by a Committee of about twenty volunteers with the help of a part-time Administration Assistant. The Conference website went live in October.

Retreats.

Working retreats were held in January and July. The annual member meeting and celebration was held in September at R. Michelson Galleries. Over 45 members attended the event.



PROGRAMMING

1606 community members attended one or more of our events during 2024.

10 Craft workshops totaling 202 participants took place online and/or in person. SDWG hosts included: Athol Public Library, Forbes Library, Northampton Center for the Arts, and Lilly Library.

SDWG is strengthened by community partnerships. We continue to work with area libraries, nonprofits, and businesses to host our events and programs.






Poetry Critique Meet-up, co-sponsored by the Northampton Center for the Arts and hosted by Michael Goldman, continued virtually. This program met 2x monthly with a total of 80 poets.

Poetry Share, a seasonal program co-sponsored with Belding Memorial Library in Ashfield and facilitated by poet and our former Administrative Director Arianna Alexsandra Collins, through her business Offerings for Community Building. This program met 4 times with 6-11 participants and a total of 37 participants.

Straw Dog Writes, a weekly online meet-up continued this year, meeting 50 times, with a total of 200 participants over the course of the year.

Writers-in-Residence Reading, in collaboration with The Mount: Edith Wharton's Home in Lenox, 42 people attended a reading on Zoom with the Writers-in-Residence.














Writers Night Out, offered on the first Tuesday of each month, is held in the Coolidge Room of Forbes Library. Ten readers are randomly selected to read for up to 5 minutes, after which, a Featured Reader shares their work and discusses the life of writing and publishing. 25–30 people participate in this monthly event, 364 total. Featured readers included: Alexis Johnson, Diana Whitney, Doug Anderson, Jessica Jopp, Cherryl Jensen, Linda Wlodyka, Dina Friedman, Dean Cycon, Steve Bernstein, and Deborah Gorlin. Numerous friendships and writing groups have formed through Writers Night Out.







STRAW DOG WRITERS GUILD CONFERENCE



The WriteAngles Writers Conference was held on April 6, 2024, at the Northampton Center for the Arts. A one-day program, it featured a keynote address by Shanta Lee, who was presented with the second Abel Meeropol Social Justice Writing Award, and twelve sessions, including panels, roundtable discussions, and participatory workshops. The conference was organized and run by a committee of about twenty volunteers with the help of a part-time administration assistant.




Some important points about WriteAngles:

- Conference registration sold out; 150 people attended, including 31 presenters, of whom 45% were people of color.
- About 25% of attendees received scholarships.
- Individual zoom meetings with literary agents were offered in the week leading up to the conference.
- Sponsorships, grants, and partnerships with local arts organizations and businesses kept the conference affordable. The conference ended up with a \$35,000 surplus.
- Other benefits to participants included the opportunity to publish work in the WriteAngles Journal, to win a Book and Writing Bundle, ASL interpreters, and the Daisy Mathias Memorial Scholarship, given to a graduating high school senior interested in creative writing.





2024 FINANCES



Income

Our operating account income for 2024 was \$20,923. The bulk of our income came from memberships and grants. Our restricted funds income was \$55,416. This included grants, sponsorships, and registration fees for the WriteAngles Conference, contributions to support the Writers-in-Residence program, a grant for the Emerging Writer Fellowship, and underwriting for Writers Night Out. The combined total income of the operating account and our restricted funds was \$76,339.

Expenses

Our operating account expenses for 2024 were \$31,996. The bulk of expenses are independent contractor fees; followed by "Other Expenses" which include insurance, Chamber of Commerce membership, PayPal fees, web hosting, QuickBooks and Zoom subscriptions; as well as fees paid to featured readers and presenters. Our restricted funds expenses were \$22,815, most of which were for the WriteAngles conference. We did not spend money on the Writers-in-Resident Program because we paid 2024 fees at the end of 2023. The combined total of operating and restricted funds expenses was \$54,811.



Account Balances: As of December 31st, our operating account balance was \$12,573. Our restricted funds balance was \$69,859.01, totaling \$82,432.
